## INDIA - WORLDVIEW INSTITUTE

The year started with Laura-Lee Alford co-teaching with Stephen Thang Li Lian, one of our recent graduates from Myanmar. They were followed by James & Toree Overton teaching during the month of August.

Stephen was scheduled to return and teach during September, but was denied his visa. Our only solution was for Laura-Lee to return and teach a class on short notice. She arrived on Sunday, August 31 to start teaching on Monday, September 1.

Laura-Lee is the real deal. She is a genuine, dedicated servant with a passion for God. Your prayers for her during this month would be much appreciated. I would also ask you to consider supporting her financially. She has spent most of the last three years on the field and has not been able to invest the time necessary to raise sufficient support.

## CHINA/NEPAL TRIP IN OCTOBER

Tim, Bob and I will soon be leaving on a two-week trip to China and Nepal.

Before returning home, we will travel to Kathmandu and visit our associates, the Levines and Knickerbockers. Work has begun on the Lowa - one of many Tibetan languages without Scripture.

We have a team of five traveling to Arua, Uganda in November where Dr. Bill Patterson will be teaching a class on Bible Translation Principles to our seven Ma'adi translators-in-training. This will be an exciting training time. This translation project is scheduled to officially launch in mid-2015.
