## Project Updates

The **INDIA PROJECT** (Coimbatore, India) is doing well. Five students will graduate on March 10th with their Masters Degree in Bible Translation. The Overton Family is doing a tremendous job leading this program.

The **LIANGMAI PROJECT** (Manipur, India) is moving forward. We should soon be able to print the Gospel of John. Over \$50,000.00 has been given this year toward the building of a translation and ministry center for this project and future projects.

The **TIBETAN PROJECT** is progressing well. We are about halfway through the Lowa translation. Please pray for additional team members for this project.

The **ASANG KHONGSO** Project (Myanmar) started with Matthew and is now working on the Gospel of John. Funds were recently given for solar equipment and battery backup so the work can be more consistent in an area of with unreliable power sources.

The **MADI PROJECT** (Arua, Uganda) now has 4 dedicated national translators working full time. We lost one of our translators this week. In spite of this setback, the men almost have the Gospel of Mark ready to print.

The **RUNYANKORE PROJECT** (Mbarara, Uganda) is going through the final checking processes—taking longer than we expected. Over \$50,000.00 has been given and we plan to go to print soon.
