Runyankore Update (Uganda)

Once we had the NT all formatted, we decided to ask the translators to read it through one last time. It has passed all other checking processes, but we want to be thorough. We have settled on prices and quantities for printing and we have the funds in hand. Our goal is to have them printed and shipped sometime in June so we can plan an early July dedication service. Liangmai Update (India)

We were able to transport four (4) new computers to India for the Liangmai translation team. Wangrai met us in Bangalore and we delivered them to him. Thanks to those who gave to meet this need.

Madi Update (Uganda)

Unusual circumstances have led to moving our translation project back to Moyo in northern Uganda, the hometown district of our translators. This required funds for moving expenses for three families and the office furniture, three motorcycles, school fees for children of the translators, six months up-front rental on a house/translation center, solar power and backup systems, and a host of miscellaneous expenses which all totaled about \$6,000.00. I am HAPPY to say that all those needs have been met. A family in our home church gave enough to buy two of the motorcycles before I even began to address the needs. The Lord provided an excellent house with good secure fencing

around the property, The house has three bedrooms, two bathrooms, and extra living quarters behind the house where one of our translator's families will live. With a little paint, some new lights and some minor repairs, we are already up and running.

Many thanks to Associate Sam Moss for being on-site to help with this transition. After a couple weeks of transition, the project is back on track and the men are making good progress. They are running a final check on the Gospel of Mark and we plan to print about 3,000 copies soon.
