RUNYANKORE NT <u>Printed! Shipped!</u> <u>Delivered! Dedicated!</u>

With our traveling team of 16, we had a wonderful time in Mbarara, Uganda celebrating the completion of the Runyankore NT! It was perhaps the most exciting event I have ever had in almost 30 years of ministry.

The service was supposed to be outdoors under 4 rented tents to accommodate the expected crowd of 400+. It rained all night, leaving 4 inches of standing water on the grounds. So we moved indoors to the church auditorium. We still had more than 300 show up and the building was jam-packed inside with several more sitting on the covered porch in front of the building looking in. Our lead translator, Robert, spoke first, then I was blessed to give the dedication message. At the end of the 2½ hour service, we presented the New Testaments to the translators. They presented them to the several dozen pastors who came, and then the pastors gave them to the people. We were all crying!

From the congregation, someone started to sing. Then the whole group lifted their New Testaments in the air and joined in the song. When there were finished, Robert led them all in reading John 3:16 aloud and we closed with a prayer of dedication. It was a thrilling experience. By the time we ended the service, the rains had stopped and we were able to serve a nice meal to all the guests out under the tents.

After eleven years of work with our translation team, there are now more than 5 million Runyankore speakers who have an accurate translation of the New Testament. Praise the Lord!! Good progress is being made as they continue work on the Old Testament. We look forward to the day we can dedicate the entire Bible.
