Project News

#1 — Lhukonzo

In September we finalized the associate's agreement for the Lhukonzo project in Kasese, Uganda. The work has begun with two national translators and they are already making good progress with the rough draft translation in the Gospel of John. Their training will continue with both WorldView staff members and with the assistance of national translators from both of our other Uganda projects; the Madi and Runyankore.

#2 — Persia

This translation work for an Iranian language group was launched officially in March and introduced in the June 2019 newsletter. Our Associates, Nathan & Alicia, are now on deputation. Their first child, a boy named Bennett Lee was born on November 22nd. They are happy parents now getting used to deputation life with a little baby.

We are so blessed to report that the Persia Project was recently taken on for support by a businessman who is giving \$2,000.00 / month to fund this work. This is our support goal for each project, but this is the first one to be fully supported. We are EXCITED and so deeply grateful for the Lord's provision!!

Please pray that Nathan & Alicia will be able to get on the field in Armenia very soon and begin the work.

#3 — Liangmai

A large gift was just committed to the Liangmai project designated to help them finish the second floor on their building project. This will allow for the expansion of the Christian day school and the Bible institute in addition to providing housing for some of the translators.

The rough draft of the NT is finished. The focus is now on the checking processes for the Gospel of John. Our hope is to print it by the summer of 2020.

#4 — Tibetan

After training FIVE Tibetan believers to work with us during the last 5 years, four of them have obtained visas and left the Nepal. Cultural pressures and family issues continue to make the work very difficult for our single remaining worker. In spite of all this, the work goes on. We hope to print the Gospel of Mark by the summer of 2020. And we are planning to add another translator to this team late next year.

#5 — Madi

In January Sam Moss, Bill Fennell and me will host a pastor's conference in the Adjumani region of northern Uganda in partnership with our Madi translators. We are expecting about 100 pastors to attend the meeting.

#6 — India

In February we will host our 12th Annual Conference in South India. Next week I will meet with the pastors who are traveling with us to go through the visa application process. This has become increasingly difficult as the India government is really cracking down on all religious activity. *Please pray that we can all get approved visas so the conference can go on.*
