The back-translation has been submitted and is being checked. This means we are in the latter stages of the work and getting closer to printing this New Testament.

Myanmar has been in turmoil since the military takeover one year ago. Attacks on civilians are still happening. Please pray for safety for Rama's family.

## Lhukonzo Project (Uganda)

This new project is off to a great start. We have four translators on the team and much of their training has been completed. Please pray for this team and for Matt Stensaas as he oversees this project.

## Madi Project (Uganda)

**Anders Swanson** joined WorldView back in June of 2021. He will serve as an associate on this project. Anders earned a master's degree in Bible translation from Baptist College of Ministry. He spent several months on the field already as an intern and has proven to be a valuable team member. He has officially begun deputation. Please consider supporting him. Our newly hired Madi translators made it through the probationary period and getting back to a team of five has made a huge difference.



## Runyankore Project (Uganda)

Work on the Old Testament continues. Most of the rough draft is complete and checking processes are fully underway. We are hopeful for a printing of the whole Bible sometime during 2023 or early 2024.

## Pamiri Project

**Jeff & Patricia** are the newest couple to join WorldView Ministries. I met Jeff in 2017 when I spoke at Pensacola Christian College. He had already surrendered to Bible translation.
