Runyankore Project (Uganda)

We have begun some back-translation for various portions of the OT. This is one of our finals checking steps. We anticipate continuing this for the next several months as we work toward completion.

Persia Project (Armenia)

We are blessed to report a recent encounter with a family of six who have come to Christ. Discipleship has begun and will be a long process. Please pray for **Nathan & Alicia** to have wisdom as they seek to help this family, and pray that more families from this target people group will be saved.

Liangmai Project (India)

For several weeks now, there has been great chaos in Manipur. What started as a tribal conflict quickly became religious persecution. The Meitei tribals have primarily targeted the Kuki tribals with violence and murder. Recent reports reveal over 100 killed and more than 40,000 displaced. Over 300 churches and hundreds of homes have been burned to the ground.

Please pray for our team. Although the violence has not reached their villages, as a precaution, we have relocated our team so they can focus on the work.
