Asang Khongso Project

The desperate situation in Myanmar continues to worsen. The military has essentially declared war on their own people and thousands have died. A Covid resurgence has also resulted in a great number of deaths due to the lack of medical help and supplies. A trusted contact recently informed us that almost 100 pastors have died of Covid in the last few weeks.

Our associate is in serious need of prayer. I did not get Rama's regular report at the end of June. Please pray for his safety and protection for the work that has already been accomplished that it will not be lost.

Pamiri Project

Tim & Cara and family have returned to the field! Praise the Lord!! They are residing in the capital city for a short time until extended visas can be obtained and they can safely make the trip out to their village. Refugees are pouring in from Afghanistan because the withdrawal of American forces has resulted in a power grab by the

Taliban. The Ismaeli sect of Islam is fleeing from the Taliban (Sunni Muslims). The potential silver lining of this dark cloud is that it may be bringing native speakers of our target languages in closer proximity to our associate. This could result in good progress for the project once they return to the village.

Tibetan Project

Lloyd has been on the field for about 4 months. Intensive language studies has already resulted in Lloyd being able to hold conversations with Tibetan speakers.
